### <Tips on how to fill in the worksheet>

Three colors used in the Australian flag are red, white, and blue.

The Union Jack is the national flag of Great Britain, and the five stars on the right hand side represent the Southern Cross.

The number of pointed tips of the biggest star represents the states and territories of Australia.
